Rhythm: Country Dance, Reel

Notes: This fine old reel is said to have been composed in honor of a young man, John Duffy--better known as 'Jack' Duffy--who lived in the townland of Lattan, near (Walter 'Piper') Jackson's home in the parish of Aughnamulien. Duffy being a fine, strapping young man, a local Adonis, and an incomparable dancer in those days when dancing was a fine art in Ireland, he won Jackson's friendship and esteem to such a degree, that the great composer immortalized him in the beautiful tune, 'Jack o' Lattan.'
