

The ms. predates the introduction of quadrille-based polkas and slides that now characterize the music of Sliabh Luachra region, thought to have been introduced in the latter 19th century.

Known as the â Dean of Old-Time Fiddlers,â Joseph Mulkey Kent won 31 first prizes for his fiddling, including the 1927 Arkansas State Fiddle Championship. Recorded in 1959 by John Quincy Wolf (Lyon College).
